EVENTS

IWRA organises and supports international water congresses and events that advance knowledge, policy, and management of water resources worldwide.

GEOGRAPHICAL CHAPTERS

IWRA actively promotes knowledge exchange at the global and regional levels. The importance of locally based knowledge and experience is emphasised through the exchange of this information at international networking events and through geographical chapters. These chapters further advance IWRA's mission on a smaller scale, focusing its activities and enabling regional networking among IWRA members. IWRA presently has 7 Geographical Chapters in China, Egypt, India, Japan, Mongolia, Latin America & the Caribbean, and Oceania.

Since 1973, IWRA has held a **World Water Congress** every two years in various locations across the world. The objective of the World Water Congress is to provide a meeting place to share experiences, promote discussion, and present new knowledge, research results, and latest developments in the field of water sciences around the world. In December 2025, IWRA holds the XIX World Water Congress in Marrakech, Morocco. **More info: worldwatercongress.com**

Since 2020, our **Online Conferences** organised with the support of organisations such as UNESCO and FAO have become one of our major activities and a sign of our growth. Themes so far have been 'Addressing Groundwater Resilience under Climate Change' (2020) and 'Water, Food and Public Health in a Changing World' (2021). 'Water Quality and Contaminants of Emerging Concern' brought the theme for October's Conference in 2022.

Since 2024, IWRA has organised the **Islands Water Congresses**. With the 1st Islands Water Congress in the Faroe Islands, under the theme of "Freshwater and Islands: Administration, Collaboration and Innovation", IWRA marked a significant milestone in addressing the pressing freshwater challenges faced by island communities worldwide. IWRA celebrates excellence in global water management through four distinguished awards:

WATER DROP AWARD

Honours a student or early-career professional—generally under 35—who has delivered an innovative contribution to the water sector.

VEN TE CHOW MEMORIAL AWARD & LECTURE

Established in memory of IWRA's first president, this award invites the recipient to deliver a distinguished lecture at the World Water Congress.

CRYSTAL DROP AWARD

Presented at each World Water Congress to an individual or organisation whose work has made a significant impact on improving the world's water situation.

WATER INTERNATIONAL BEST PAPER AWARD

Granted annually to authors published in Water International, recognising excellence in originality, innovation, technical quality, and overall contribution to the field.

CAPACITY BUILDING AT THE CORE OF THE ASSOCIATION

Water management and resources, like other areas, require constant updates, knowledge enhancement, and sharing. With that in mind, IWRA offers Master Classes and webinars conducted by reputable experts from around the world, covering current global themes such as ecocide, water law, water cooperation, transboundary water issues, and groundwater, among others.

In 2023, a 5-module virtual masterclass event on Institutional Responsibility to support SDG 6 and the rights to water and sanitation was organised and offered in collaboration with Human Right 2 Water (HR2W) and South Africa's Water Research Commission (WRC). It convened hundreds of participants from more than 100 countries. Each Master Class typically comprises a 90-minute public lecture, followed by a 60-minute skill-building workshop for IWRA members.

IWRA offers Master Classes, training courses, puzzle games and webinars.
